

Spay and Neuter Policy

This policy is applicable to all members of Canine Allies CIC, and their assistance dogs, or assistance dogs in training. Failure to comply will result in expulsion from the organisation.

As per the Assistance Dogs International (ADI) policy, all dogs must be sterilised before committing to their role as an assistance dog.

For this reason, a dog may not undertake a public access test before this procedure is carried out. Valid documentation from a veterinarian must be provided before the dog is allowed to attempt the public access test.

The sterilisation of a dog is to take place in accordance with the appropriate breed legislation for the specific dog, so therefore we would ask that you consult with a veterinarian to discuss the most appropriate time for your dog to have this procedure.
